### St Martin's, Liskeard:

A fortnightly support group for women who may have issues of one form or another launched in early September. 10 women attended the first session and 6 the second. Crèche facilities are also available. It is wonderful to witness the way that the women are already supporting and encouraging one another, and great to see that we have created a space where they feel safe and confident enough to share with one another.

Our Blaze Children's Club is being relaunched in November as Blaze Supper Club. This will be held every Monday during termtime with the aim of providing a meal for families who are struggling, and a space for children to come and relax with their friends after school.

Our Youth Worker Hannah has transformed our Cellars into a cosy, café-style space for the youth to use at our Youth Café and Youth Alpha. Hannah has spent months cleaning, decorating and making the space feel like a home from home - we are so excited to see the space being used and enjoyed by the youth!

Our Pastoral Team sent letters to each of our local care homes offering communion services for their staff and residents. Two care homes have responded with invitations for our team to go in once a month, the first one being on Tuesday 5th November. Please pray for our Pastoral Team as they start this new and exciting ministry and for our local care homes and their residents.









#### **Dobwalls United Church:**

At the beginning of September as well as welcoming Rev Mark Wade to our church, as a united church we also welcomed our new Methodist minister Rev Janet Park. For the last 18 months our church has been without any ministers. Janet is the minister of the Mine and Moor cluster of churches which are part of the new South East Cornwall Methodist Circuit.



Our very successful Warm Space will restart for its third year on November 5 from 11am until 3pm in the church hall and is on each week until Easter. This is run by Doris, Sandra and Joy, with Pat helping as needed. About 20 people attend weekly and many new friendships have been made. One lady comes from Plymouth to enjoy our hospitality. We are open to everyone, people in need, people who just want some companionship and people who are lonely or new to the area. No questions are asked and all are made welcome.

They are given tea or coffee with biscuits on arrival, a hot meal around 12 noon followed by yet more tea or coffee and cake. When it is time to leave everyone is given a pasty or savoury slice as another snack or meal to take home. These are very kindly given to us by Samworth Brothers, the parent company of Ginsters of Callington. There is no charge and donations are not taken. All costs are funded by grants.

Knit and Knatter restarted in September and runs fortnightly on Thursdays from 2pm to 4pm. It started with four members and regularly has over 20 people who knit, sew or just simply chat.

Last winter on a cold, horrible day during Warm Space a lady knocked the door and said the bus had failed to arrive and could she use our loo. We gave her a hot drink and biscuits and invited her to stay for lunch but she declined as she didn't want to miss the next bus. As she left we invited her to come back to Warm Space. We gave her a pasty to take home and one for her husband. A few weeks later she turned up at Warm Space and we discovered she was a new resident of the village. She has since made lots of friends and is one of our regulars. Although the volunteers who run Warm Space are all Christians, we do not discuss our beliefs with those who attend. They all know that we belong to the church and we are here if they need us. Several weeks later our "new" lady from the bus stop asked if we would mind if she came to church on Sunday as she had not gone to church for quite some time. Since then she has become a regular worshipper at Dobwalls and is a much-loved member of our congregation.

Our next Warm Space initiative starts on Tuesdays from 5th November, from 11am to 3pm in the church hall.

#### St Keyne Church:

In our prayers: Margaret is in hospital and Christine is still recovering at home. We thank God that Margaret's stroke was early on a Sunday morning so we missed her at Church and were able to find her and get help immediately. Please do pray for both Margaret and Christine.

We are looking forward to the installation of a toilet, mains water and drainage in the church. Detailed plans have been finalised and contractors have been invited to tender for work and have each visited the church with the architect.

Our services over Christmas include two Christingles - one specifically for the school, and another by request of children and parents from the village, including those who are now regulars at Messy Church. Some children will get DOUBLE sweets!
