Life Group Questions

From David Hart based on his sermon at 9.15am and 11am services on 3 May

Readings: Romans 12:1-9 and John 21:1-19

1. Can you think of something in your life that has been a massive change? Perhaps a change of family circumstances, work or an experience of God. Share how this felt and how you responded to it. Did you choose the change or did it happen to you despite whether you wanted it to or not?
2. Think about how Peter felt as he crawled up the beach and saw Jesus. What change came across him do you think, and what did he have to give up in order to have that conversation with Jesus?
3. What do you think Paul meant when he advised the Roman Christians to present themselves as 'living sacrifice'?
4. What is God saying to you in this moment. Is he asking you to change something in your life?
