Life Group Questions

From Angus Parker based on his sermon at 9.15am and 11am services on Sunday 6 September

WORD

1.) What struck you from the accounts of Christian persecution in the talks on Sunday?

2.) **Read Acts 19: 23 - 34 & 2 Corinthians 1: 8 & 9**

Imagine you were there with Paul at this riot in Ephesus. How would you have felt?

3.) **Read 2 Corinthians 1: 3 - 11**

a.) Looking at verses 3 & 4 -

i.) How do these words encourage you?

ii.) Perhaps one or two in the group might want to share an example of how God comforted them

iii.) What do these words mean in terms of our fellowship with other Christians

b.) Looking at verses 8 to 10

Paul talks of God delivering him from "deadly peril" - Can we **always** expect God to comfort us by delivering us / removing "trouble" we face?

c.) Looking at verses 6 & 7

How else might God comfort us in our troubles?

d.) Looking at verses 10 & 11

Paul frequently in his letters encourages Christians to pray not only for him but for each other

What do you find helpful in reminding you to pray for other Christians?
